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INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The *Manual for the Study of European History* is designed to meet a double need. Primarily it offers a list of readings for students in the introductory course in European History at the University of Chicago. The division of the bibliography into weeks of class work and large topics and the grouping of the titles under Prescribed and Collateral Reading are due to this purpose of the manual. Likewise it is the need and capacity of the student in his Freshman and Sophomore years at college which has determined very largely both the selection and the arrangement of the books cited. It was not the intention to make the bibliography in any sense exhaustive, but the compilers hope that on the whole a representative and fair selection of titles is here offered, sufficient for the varying needs of students and instructors.

It will be apparent, however, that both the amount and the scope of the reading are beyond the requirements of even the exceptional student. This is due to the fact that in the second place the *Manual* undertakes to furnish a guide for reading in European History for those outside of academic halls. The number and variety of references given make allowance for varied interests and also for varying local library facilities.

To enhance the usefulness of the *Manual* a list of map references has been added wherever possible. Likewise the spirit of the several periods and the point of view of changing ages are represented in the works cited under Source Reading.

In its present form the *Manual* is a considerably modified and recast new edition of an earlier classroom manual used at the University of Chicago. It has thus grown out of the teaching experience of several years and embodies the judgment of a number of teachers who in the course of these years have tested out these readings in actual classroom instruction.

Authors and titles of works cited in the *Manual* are quoted in full only the first time a given book is mentioned within the three divisions of the subject.
