## FOREWORD

A separate volume for Delhi was published for the first time in 1931 and the procedure is repeated on this occasion. It is not however possible to give anything in the nature of a report or discussion of the figures since the officer who did the enumeration handed over charge early in June 1941 and the Census Commissioner for India passed to other heavy duties with effect from mid-July.

While Mr. Fazl-i-Hahi did the enumeration, tabulation, for reasons indicated below, was carried out in the Census Commissioner's office.

Tabulation for Delhi is characterised by two important differences from the rest of British India. It covers the whole list of tables and its record has been produced on machines. This is the first case in India where machines have been used and the operation was carried out not on specially made or hired machines but on the spare time of equipment being worked in other departments of the Government of India. This innovation is discussed in full elsewhere.

Thus the record is in a permanent form in the shape of cards which can pass through sorting machines, already in use in government offices in Delhi, at any time for the extraction of further details.

Till 1931 information on industry was produced through a quite separate enquiry on different forms. In 1931 it was decided to see whether this information could not be more conveniently and cheaply procured through the ordinary census questionnaire. Truncated tabulation in that year omitted treatment of industry. The experiment was repeated in 1941 on the simplest possible form of question. A comparison with the returns of the Director of Industries, Delhi however shows that the results from the census question differ so widely as to make it clear that the enquiry has not covered the ground. Specialised information of this kind is probably not procurable from the workers' end and the conclusion seems to emerge that industrial information of the type contemplated must be procured through employers and a special enquiry.

## I-- AREA, HOUSES AND POPULATION

The areas in column 2 are those of the latest determinations of the Survey Department. The difference of 1 sq. mile from the last census is due to recalculation.

2. A house was defined at this census as the dwelling place of a commensal family. "Occupied house" means a census house.

3. "Towns" include municipalities, civil lines not included in municipal limits, cantonments and other places of usually not less than 5,000 inhabitants and possessing distinct urban characteristics. "Village" means a revenue village. "Urban" and "rural" refer to persons living in towns or villages as above defined.

4. The urban/rural ratio when towns with a population of 5,000 or over is taken as urban is 3 : 1.

5. There is only one tehsil in the province, hence Provincial Tables I and II have not been prepared.

Everything was done however to make the question as readily comprehensible as possible and it formed part of the common questionnaire applied to all.

The figures tabulated refer to actual search for employment, not merely to the absence of a particular occupation.
