REVISED RATES OF PAY RULES.

GOVERNMENT OF INDIA, HOME DEPARTMENT, NOTIFICATION NO. F. 386/33-ESTS., DATED THE 22ND SEPTEMBER 1933.

In exercise of the power conferred by sub-rule (2) of rule 33, by rule 37 and by rule 44 of the Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, the Governor General in Council is pleased to make the following rules :—

Rules.

1. These rules may be called the Revised Rates of Pay Rules.

2. The revised rates of pay of the services and posts included in the annexed Schedule shall be as shown therein.

*3. The rates of pay shown in the Schedule, as well as the revised rates of pay prescribed by the Governor General in Council by executive orders for the personnel mentioned in clause (2) of the notification of the Government of India in the Home Department no. F. 9/4/33-Ests., dated the 27th November 1933, shall apply to :—

- (i) all persons who enter or have entered or are or have been re-employed in Government service, whether in a permanent or other capacity, on or after 16th July 1931 ;
- (ii) persons who were in service whether in a permanent or other capacity on 15th July 1931, if there is a break in their service after that date ;
- (iii) persons who were on probation on 15th July 1931, and who were subsequently confirmed in the service or post for which they were on probation, provided that they were specifically warned at the time of appointment on probation that they would be brought on to the revised scales of pay when introduced ; and
- (iv) persons who entered service as a result of a competitive examination held before 16th July 1931, provided they were specifically warned before or at the time of the examination that the rates of pay of the posts of services for which they were candidates were under revision.

NOTE 1.—For the purpose of these Rules the terms “ Government service ” shall be deemed to include prior service under Provincial Governments in India.

NOTE 2.—For the purpose of clause (ii) of this rule, a person re-employed under any of the Re-employed Personnel (Conditions of Service) Rules shall be regarded as having had a break in his service.

NOTE 3.—Persons transferred from the service of a local Government to that of the Government of India shall be deemed to have been specifically warned for the purposes of clause (iii) or clause (iv) of this rule if having been on probationary service under the local Government on the 15th July 1931, or having entered the service of the local Government, as a result of a competitive examination held before the 16th July 1931, they received from the local Government a warning of the nature mentioned in clause (iii) or clause (iv) as the case may be with reference to the revision of scales and rates of pay by the local Government.

14. The pay of persons to whom these rules apply shall, unless in any case the Governor General in Council by special order otherwise directs, be re-fixed with effect from the first day of the month following that on which the revised rates of pay are prescribed, at the rate which would have been admissible had the revised rates of pay been in force from the beginning of their service or re-employment, no re-adjustments being made on this account in respect of pay earned before that date.

SCHEDULE.

NOTE.—Where any post is held by an officer under the rule-making control of the Secretary of State for India, the rates shown in this Schedule shall not apply².

APPENDIX.

Executive orders, etc., issued in connexion with the Revised Rates of Pay Rules.

(1) *G. I., F. D. Resolution no. D. 4523-Ex. I|31, dated the 9th July 1931.*—Pending completion of the review of expenditure of the Government of India which is now proceeding, the Governor General in Council has been pleased to decide, as an *ad interim* measure, that all appointments to any posts, permanent or temporary, made on or after the 16th July 1931, of persons not in Government service on the 15th July 1931, whose pay the Governor-General in Council is competent to determine under the Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, 1930, shall be made on a provisional footing, that is to say, in an officiating capacity.

The above decision shall not apply to police establishment enrolled under the Police Act or to warders or head-warders (including female warders) in the Jail Department.

(2) *G. I., F. D., O. M. no. F. 36 (147)-Ex. I|32, dated the 17th August 1932.*—The question has been raised whether the embargo imposed in paragraph 1 of the Finance Department Resolution no. D. 4523-Ex. I|31, dated the 9th July 1931, *viz.*, that all appointments to any posts, permanent or temporary, made on or after the 16th July 1931, of persons not in Government service on the 15th July 1931, whose pay the Governor-General in Council is competent to determine under the Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, shall be made on a provisional footing, that is to say, in an officiating capacity, should be removed in regard to appointments to posts which have survived retrenchment.

In view of the fact that further economies may be required and that the question of the revision of pay-scales is now under the consideration of the Government of India, it has been decided that the ban on confirmations, as imposed in the Resolution quoted above, should continue to be imposed until further orders.

(3) *G. I., F. D., letter no. F. 36 (147)-Ex. I|32, dated the 1st November 1932.*—I am directed to refer to this Department endorsement no. D. 4523-Ex. I|31, dated the 9th July 1931, forwarding a copy of the Resolution quoted above and to say that the question having arisen of the exact meaning of the term "Government service" in that Resolution, the Governor-General in Council has been pleased to decide that a person who on the 15th July 1931 was (i) in the whole-time service of Government and (ii) remunerated either by salary or recurring honorarium, should, for the purposes of the Resolution, be held to have been in "Government service" on that date even if his status on that date was not substantively permanent but provisionally permanent, substantive or provisionally substantive in a temporary post, officiating in a permanent or temporary post or probationary against a permanent vacancy. It follows that a Government servant not then in permanent service if he is confirmed after the 15th July 1931 without a break in service will for the purposes of the application of the new scales of pay and the new leave rules be dealt with in the same way as if he had been in permanent service on that date.

(4) *Home Department Press Communiqué, dated the 22nd September 1933.*—The General Purposes Sub-Committee of the Retrenchment Advisory Committee considered it advisable and necessary that the scales of pay of future entrants to the public services should be revised with a view to place them on an economic basis. Last year Mr. Sloan, C.I.E., I.C.S., was placed on special duty with the Government of India for the purpose and new

scales of pay were drawn up for all services in consultation with the various Departments of Government. These proposals have now been carefully considered by the Governor-General in Council and he has been pleased to sanction, in regard to new entrants to Class I and Class II of the Central Services under his control, the rates of pay prescribed in notification no. F. 386|33-Establishments, dated the 22nd September 1933, which is published in the Gazette of India, dated the 23rd September 1933. Revised rates of pay for the new entrants to the subordinate services under the control of the Governor-General in Council have also been fixed in the majority of cases and will be announced in due course.

The question of the extent to which the new scales of pay should apply to Government servants who are already in Government service but who are promoted from one cadre or service to another and the revision of the scales of pay for the future entrants to services under the control of the Secretary of State are still under consideration.

Along with the question of pay scales, the leave conditions for the services have also been under examination. The existing leave rules in the Fundamental Rules have been found to be too liberal, complicated in their operation and expensive. Revised leave rules applicable to new entrants to the services under the control of the Governor-General in Council have been framed after careful consideration of the needs and circumstances of Government servants serving in their own country and are being published separately in the Gazette of India.

The Governor-General in Council has also under consideration revised pension rules which, when ready, will also be made applicable to new entrants.

(5) *G. I., F. D., O. M., no. F. 31 (4)-Ex. I|33, dated the 2nd October 1933.*—The undersigned is directed to refer to this Department Office Memorandum no. F. 36 (147)-Ex. I|32, dated the 17th August 1932, in which the provisions of Resolution, no. D. 4523-Ex. I|31, dated the 9th July 1931, that all appointments to any posts permanent or temporary, made on or after the 16th July 1931, of persons not in Government service on the 15th July 1931, whose pay the Governor-General in Council is competent to determine under the Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, shall be made on a provisional footing, that is to say, in an officiating capacity, were re-affirmed until further orders pending the revision of the scales of pay. Revised scales of pay for new entrants to services and posts under the rule-making control of the Governor-General in Council, so far as have been decided, have been published in Government of India, Home Department Notification, no. F. 386|33-Ests., dated the 22nd September 1933. The Governor-General in Council is now pleased to decide that in respect of services and posts for which new scales of pay have been introduced in the above notification, the Resolution quoted above shall no longer apply, and that in regard to services and posts for which new scales of pay may hereafter be prescribed and to services and posts for which the existing scales of pay may be announced as applicable to new entrants also, the embargo imposed in the Resolution shall be removed with effect from the date of publication of the new scales or the date of announcement of no change as the case may be.

Persons who have been employed in vacant posts in an officiating capacity, who may now be confirmed as a result of the orders conveyed in this Memorandum, may be so confirmed with effect from the date on which the posts which they are holding fell vacant, or the date of their appointment to those posts, whichever is later. Before confirmation such persons should be warned that they will be subject to the revised leave rules which will be published shortly and to the revised pension rules which may be issued for new entrants to services and posts under the control of the Governor-General in Council.

(6) *G. I., F. D., O. M., no. F. 31 (9)-Ex. I|33, dated the 18th November 1933.*—Now that the Revised Rates of Pay Rules have been issued in the Home

Department Notification, no. F. 386|33, dated the 22nd of September 1933, and the embargo on confirmations has been removed in respect of services and posts for which new scales of pay have been prescribed, the undersigned is directed to say that the new scales of pay should be applied as from the date of appointment, and confirmation should be given as from the date the person concerned would have been confirmed had there been no embargo, and increments in the new scales of pay calculated accordingly up to the present, subject to the condition that no re-adjustment will be permissible on this account in respect of the pay earned before the 1st of October 1933. The reservation imposed in paragraph 2 (i) of the Home Department Resolution no. 1062, dated the 27th of May 1920, will not apply.

I|33, dated the 20th November 1933.*—With reference to paragraph 2 of the Home Department *Press Communiqué*, dated the 22nd of September 1933, the undersigned is directed to state that the Governor-General in Council has now decided, in respect of the services and posts subject to his rule-making control in terms of the Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, that all persons who have been in continuous service since the 15th of July 1931 and who received no warning at the time of appointment that they would be given the new rates of pay, shall on promotion from a lower to a higher service, or to posts outside the time-scales, or, in the case of certain special appointments, from a lower to a higher post, be entitled to the old rates of pay of the appointment or service to which they are promoted.

(8) *G. I., F. D., O. M., no. F. 31 (10)-Ex. I|33, dated the 31st January 1934.*—In continuation of the Office Memorandum from the Finance Department, no. F. 31 (10)-Ex. I|33, dated the 20th November 1933, regarding the regulation of pay on promotion of persons who were in service on the 15th of July 1931, the undersigned is directed to say that the Governor-General in Council has been pleased to decide that a demoted officer who has been continuously in service since July 15, 1931, should be given the old rate of pay in the lower post or service to which he is demoted.

(9) *G. I., F. D., O. M., no. F. 21 (7)-Ex. I|34, dated the 1st February 1934.*—The undersigned is directed to state that in view of the general fall in prices the Government of India have considered the possibility of effecting some economy in the expenditure on inferior Government servants whose pay is met from contingencies. They have decided that, except with the special sanction of heads of departments, inferior servants employed in offices of the Central Government and paid from contingencies under Article 85 of the Civil Account Code, Volume I, should not be granted higher rates of pay than those fixed for similar inferior servants employed in the same station under the Local Government of the Province in which the office is situated.

These orders should be regarded as applying to all such inferior Government servants irrespective of their date of appointment, but there is no objection to the continuance of the existing rates of pay in the case of inferior servants, such as temporary peons, who although paid from contingencies are paid at a fixed rate corresponding to the rate prescribed for a class of pensionable Government servants who are employed on similar duties and whose pay is not charged to contingencies.

(10) *G. I., F. D., letter no. F. 31 (10)-Ex. I|33, dated the 18th April 1934.*—I am directed to say that the Governor-General in Council has been pleased to decide that the decision contained in Finance Department letter no. F. 31 (10)-Ex. I|33, dated the 20th November 1933, shall apply to persons who entered service on or after the 16th of July 1931 as the result of a competitive examination held before that date and were not warned before or at the time of the examination that the rates of pay of the services or posts for which they were candidate were under revision.

(11) *G. I., F. D., letter no. D.2864-Ex. I|34, dated the 26th July 1934.*— I am directed to refer to Finance Department letter no. F. 36 (147)-Ex. I|32, dated the 1st of November 1932, conveying the decision of the Governor-General in Council regarding the application of the term "Government Service" to persons who on the 15th of July 1931 were (i) in the whole-time service of Government and (ii) remunerated either by salary or recurring honorarium; and to say that a question having arisen whether service as an apprentice falls under the categories mentioned in that letter, the Governor-General in Council has been pleased to decide that a person who was a paid apprentice on the 15th of July 1931 should, for the purposes of the Finance Department Resolution, no. D.4523-Ex. I|31, dated the 9th of July 1931, be held to have been in "Government Service" on that date (i.e., the 15th of July 1931).

(12) *G. I., F. D., letter no. F. 21 (56)-Ex. I|34, dated the 16th August 1934.*— I am directed to invite reference to Finance Department letter no. F. 31 (10)-Ex. I|33, dated the 20th November 1933, communicating orders for regulating the pay of persons who were in service on the 15th of July 1931, on promotion from a lower to a higher service, or to posts outside the time-scales, or, in the case of certain special appointments, from a lower to a higher post, and to state that the Governor-General in Council has decided that the expression "warning at the time of appointment" contained in those orders shall mean warning given at the time of first appointment in continuous service under Government; and, in respect of persons transferred from the service of a Local Government to that of the Government of India, warning given at the time of first appointment in continuous service under the former Government.

I am to request that if the Minor Local Government see no objection, similar instructions may be issued in regard to the services and posts subject to their rule-making control.
