PREFATORY NOTE

In 1938 the Committee on Public Administration of the Social Science Research Council undertook the compilation of a list of public administration research projects in progress at the leading universities and colleges in the United States. This list was published annually (with the exception of 1942) from 1938 to 1943, under the title, Check List of Current Research in Public Administration. Owing to the restricted volume of research in this field during the War years, the compilation of the list was suspended after 1943.

The purpose of the list was to provide information about current research activities in institutions throughout the country and to serve as a means for the exchange of information among scholars with an interest in public administration. Reports from teachers of public administration indicate that it was especially useful in universities in connection with the counseling of students about research in this particular field.

The considerable increase in the volume of public administration research in the postwar period again stresses the need for an inventory of such projects, and Public Administration Service, by arrangement with the Social Science Research Council, has undertaken to continue the compilation and publication of the check list. The present list, based on information supplied by the appropriate faculty members at the various institutions, records the projects initiated or under way in 1947. As may be apparent from an examination of this list, efforts were made to include research in progress not only in schools of public administration and departments of political science, but also in departments of sociology, business administration, and social work, insofar as they are concerned with projects in public administration, and to include listings from institutions offering instruction and opportunity for research in such fields as housing, planning, etc.

The classification scheme here employed makes no claim to being a scientific catalog of the subject matter of public administration. It is merely a convenient method of grouping the projects for easy reference, and therefore no cross-referencing has been attempted. The abbreviations "Ph.D.," "M.A.," "M.S.," "M.P.A.," etc. indicate the degree in connection with which each of the projects is undertaken. When no such information is given, it may generally be assumed that the work is undertaken by faculty members or research staff without reference to an academic degree.
